Our SPaG rule that we will be focusing on this week is:

Prepositions

Monday- 'Talky SPaG' (you do not need to record anything for this lesson- it is just a discussion about the rule)

Prepositions are words that tell you the 'position' of something- so where something is.

For example, you might say:

'Can you get my coat? It's just **on top** of the chair' – The preposition here is on top as that's where it is.

Can you think of any other prepositions? Why not place a teddy or a toy in different places and see if you can say where it is to come up with more prepositions of your own!
